We are wearing Orange Shirts on September 29 in recognition of Orange Shirt Day, a day that is also now known across Canada as the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. We acknowledge the courage it has taken for survivors of Canada's Residential School system to share their stories, and help us understand what happened.

In wearing our Orange Shirts today, we are honouring and remembering all the people who have been affected by Canada's Residential Schools.

We are also learning about how we can support reconciliation. We can listen to the stories of people who experienced Residential Schools. We can read books by Indigenous authors. And we can honour and remember all of the people affected by Canada's Residential Schools as we learn to be better together.

In observance of National Day for Truth and Reconciliation on September 30th, please be advised that all Richmond school and district sites will lower the Canadian flag (and BC flag) to half-mast. Since the day falls on a weekend, the flags will be lowered on the evening of September 29th and be raised on the morning of October 3rd.

HOW WE LEARN AND WORK TOGETHER


The Board of Education recognizes its obligation to provide all members of our school district community with a positive climate and a safe, healthy environment.
