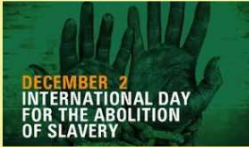

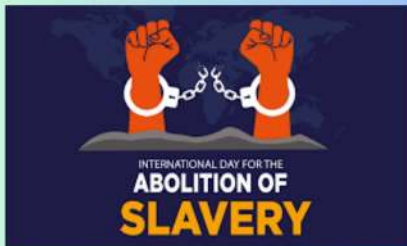

The International Day for the Abolition of Slavery is observed annually on December 2nd to commemorate the adoption of the UN Convention for the Suppression of the Traffic in Persons and of the Exploitation of the Prostitution of Others. The day focuses on eradicating contemporary forms of slavery, which include human trafficking, forced labor, and forced marriage. It serves as a reminder of historical slavery while raising awareness of modern-day slavery and encouraging action against it.



The International Day of Persons with Disabilities (IDPD) is an annual observance held on December 3rd to promote the rights and well-being of persons with disabilities in all areas of society. Proclaimed by the United Nations General Assembly in 1992, the day aims to raise awareness of disability issues and highlight the benefits of an inclusive and accessible society for everyone.



The National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence Against Women is observed annually in Canada on December 6th. This day commemorates the anniversary of the 1989 École Polytechnique massacre in Montreal, where 14 women were targeted and murdered. The day was established by the Parliament of Canada in 1991 to remember the victims and to call for an end to gender-based violence. The event is also known as White Ribbon Day, a symbol of commitment to ending male violence against women and girls.

We discuss and define online sexual exploitation in an age appropriate way and cover topics such as digital footprints & permanency, red flags of luring and grooming, sextortion, intimate image sharing, and safety tips. Workshops meet key learning outcomes as set by the BC Ministry of Education and can be catered to address specific needs.

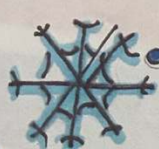
