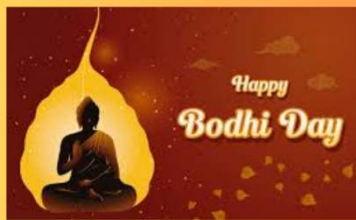


Significant Dates in our Community

Bodhi Day: Dec. 2



International Day of Persons Commemoration and Dignity of the Victims of the Crime of Genocide and of the Prevention of this Crime: Dec. 9
Human Rights Day: Dec. 10



Bodhi Day, celebrated on December 8 by Mahayana Buddhists, commemorates the day Siddhartha Gautama attained enlightenment and became the Buddha. It is also known as Buddha's Enlightenment Day or Rōhatsu. Celebrations often include prayer, meditation, reading scriptures, and lighting candles, symbolizing enlightenment.

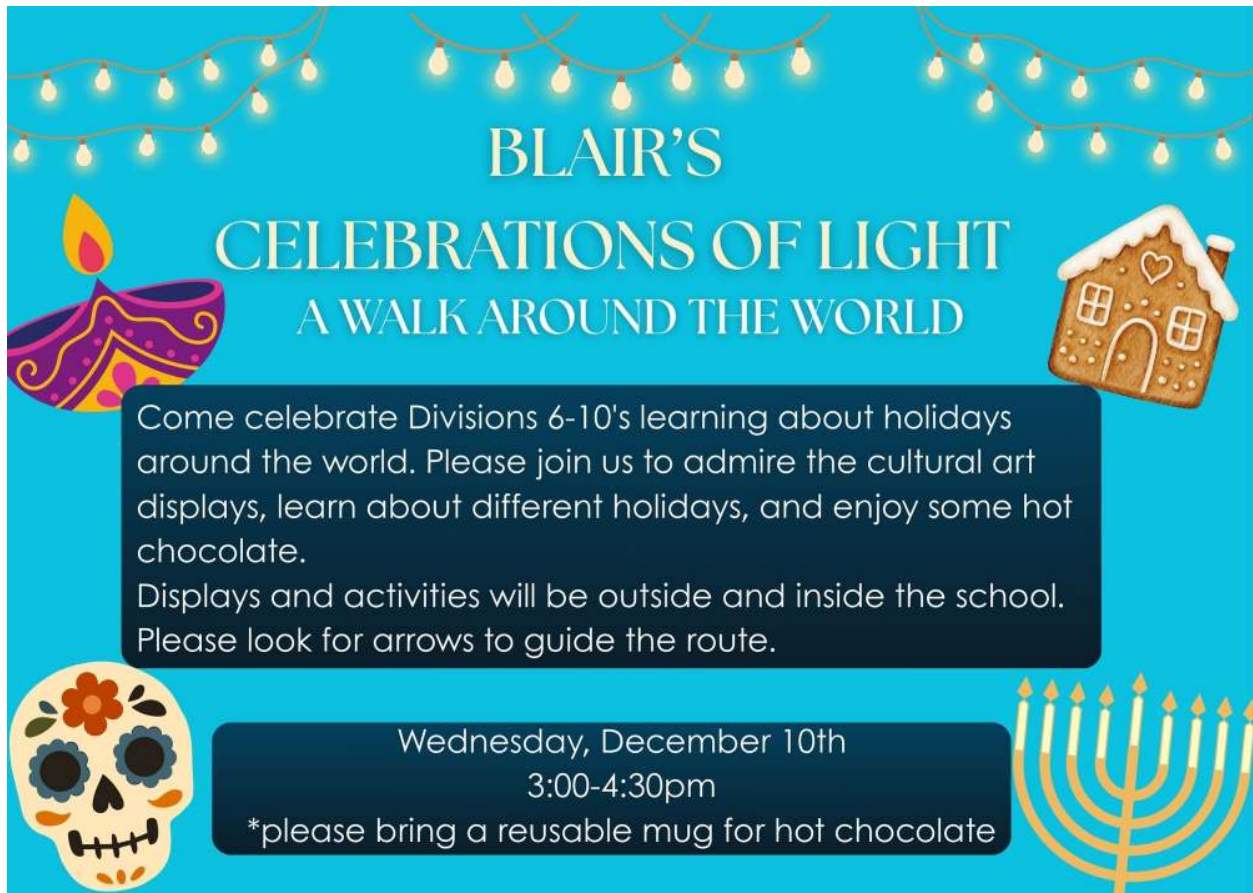
The International Day of Commemoration and Dignity of the Victims of the Crime of Genocide and of the Prevention of this Crime is observed on December 9th. It marks the anniversary of the adoption of the 1948 Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide, a treaty created in response to atrocities like the Holocaust. The day serves to both honor victims and survivors and to raise awareness about preventing future genocides through education, addressing hate speech, and strengthening international institutions.



National Human Rights Day is celebrated annually on December 10 to commemorate the adoption of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR) by the UN General Assembly in 1948. The day is a global observance to raise awareness and mobilize action to uphold the fundamental rights and freedoms of all people, as outlined in the UDHR.

All are welcome to attend this after school event on Wednesday December 10th! Visit our Library and primary classrooms.



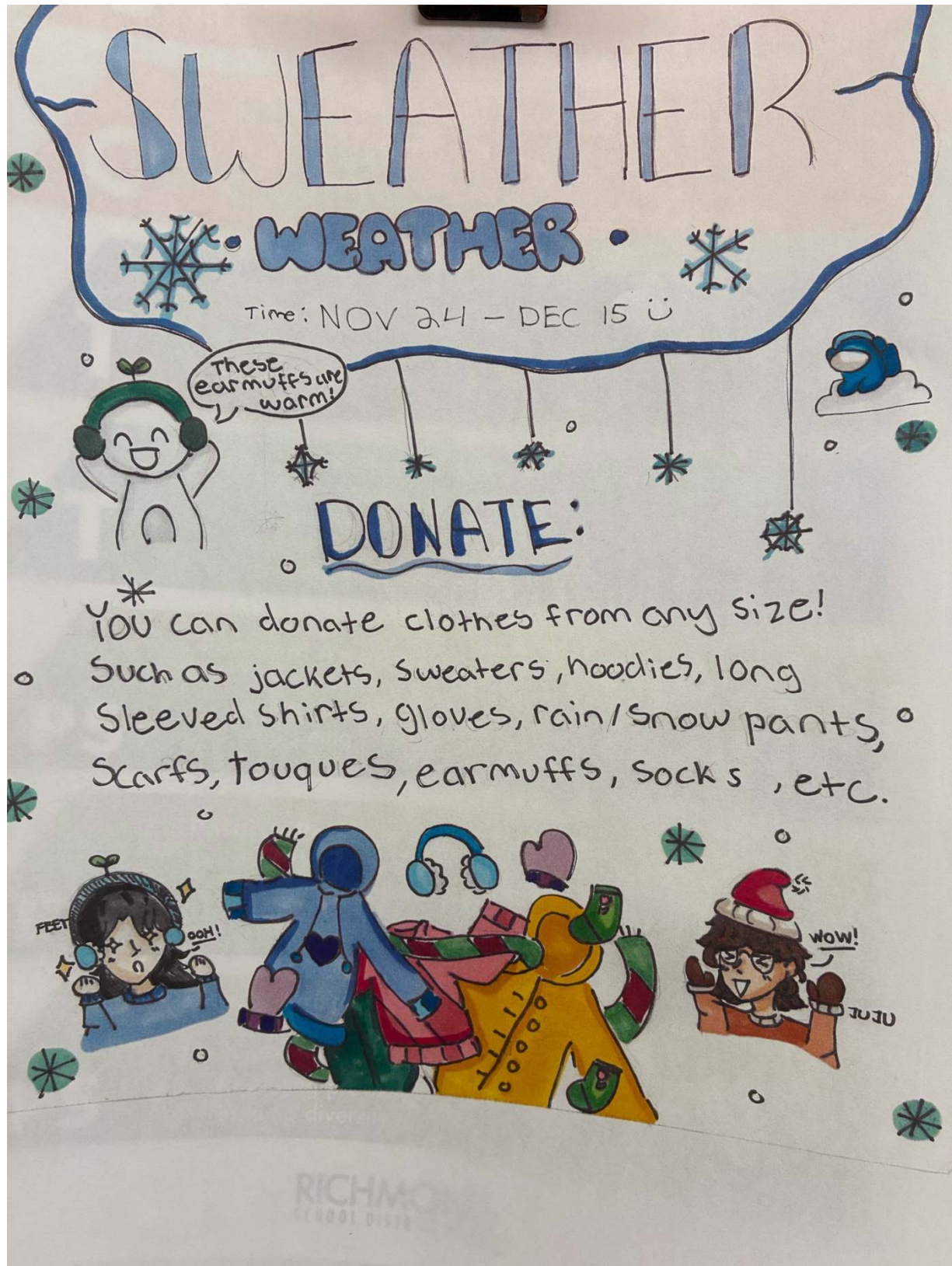
