Dear Blair Families,

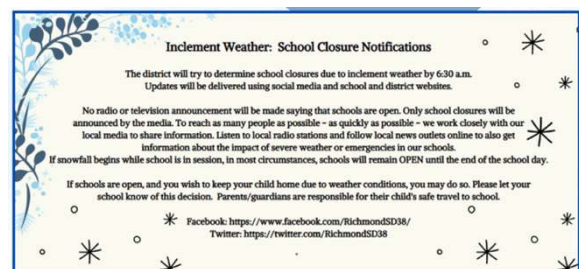

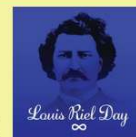

In 2026, Lunar New Year officially begins on Tuesday, February 17, marking the start of the Year of the Fire Horse. The celebrations typically last for 15 days, concluding with the Lantern Festival on March 3, 2026.

Key Details for 2026

- **Zodiac Animal:** The Year of the Fire Horse occurs once every 60 years. It is characterized by high energy, independence, and rapid change.
- **Duration:** While New Year's Day is Feb. 17, cultural festivities—often called the Spring Festival—officially run from Feb. 17 to Feb. 27, followed by the Lantern Festival preparations.



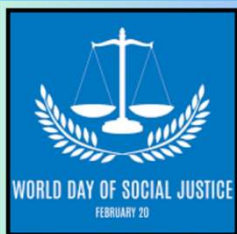
Ramadan is the holiest month in Islam, observed by Muslims worldwide as a time of fasting, prayer, reflection, and community. It falls in the ninth month of the Islamic lunar calendar and lasts 29 or 30 days, depending on the sighting of the moon. During Ramadan, Muslims fast from dawn to sunset, abstaining from food, drink, and other physical needs, focusing on spiritual growth, self-discipline, and devotion to God. Nights are spent in prayer, including Taraweeh (special nightly prayers), and the Quran is recited. The month concludes with Eid al-Fitr, a festival of feasting and gratitude. Ramadan fosters charity, compassion, and a deeper connection with faith.



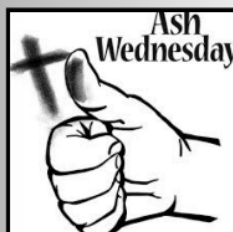
Family Day is a provincial statutory holiday in several Canadian provinces, observed on the third Monday of February. The holiday is intended for people to spend quality time with loved ones during the mid-winter break.

Common activities include:

- **Outdoor Winter Sports:** Ice skating, sledding, skiing, and snowshoeing.
- **Community Events:** Many cities host free festivals, carnivals, and museum exhibitions.
- **Indoor Fun:** Board games, movie marathons, and cooking special meals like pancakes with maple syrup.



World Day of Social Justice, observed annually on February 20, is a United Nations initiative that promotes efforts to address poverty, inequality, and social exclusion worldwide. It highlights the importance of fair opportunities, human rights, and social protections for all, regardless of gender, race, or economic status. The day serves as a call to action for governments, organizations, and individuals to work toward inclusive development, fair labor conditions, and justice for marginalized communities. Various events, discussions, and campaigns take place globally to advocate for a more just and equitable world.



Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, a 40-day period of fasting, prayer, and reflection for Christians leading up to Easter. Observed by receiving ashes on the forehead in the shape of a cross, it symbolizes repentance and mortality. It is a day of reflection, repentance, and spiritual renewal.

Louis Riel Day is celebrated in Métis homelands to commemorate the anniversary of Métis leader Louis Riel's execution in 1885. The day honors his legacy and celebrates Métis culture, traditions, and contributions to Canada. It is also observed as Family Day in other Canadian provinces, such as Manitoba, in February.

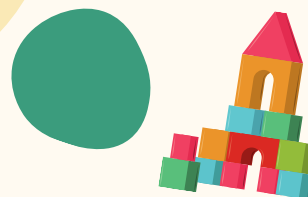
How to opt in:

To receive text alerts on multiple phones, each phone number must opt in separately by replying "Y" to 978338.



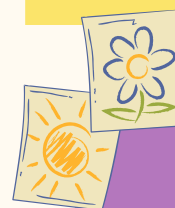
