Each year there are 6 Professional Development Days (Pro-D Days) allowed by the Ministry of Education. Students do not attend school on these days. Teachers attend workshops designed to help them learn new approaches to teaching and improve their practice. Blair School will be closed for all Pro-D days. ORANGE SHIRT DAY: WEAR ORANGE ON THURSDAY SEPTEMBER 29th

National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day takes place on September 30. A reminder that this is a commemorative day that honors the children who survived residential schools and remembers those who did not. Schools will be closed on this day. We encourage schools/departments to formally mark Orange Shirt Day on September 29, by wearing orange as a symbol of our sadness of the stripping away of culture, freedom, and self-esteem, experienced by Indigenous children over generations.



The government recently passed legislation to make **September 30**th a federal statutory holiday called the **National Day for Truth and Reconciliation**. As such, all schools in the Richmond School District will be closed on Friday, September 30, 2022.

PARKING and AFTER SCHOOL REMINDERS

Once again this year we are asking parents to respect the parking rules that we have in place at our school. All parents and students are encouraged to walk to and from school. We do have a **Drop Off/Pick Up** lane. If you are in this lane you must **NOT** leave your car unattended. If parents want to drive their children to school and walk their child to their classroom door or meeting spot they **must park on the street** and then walk their child to class. **We have no staff to supervise students after school so please ensure you pick up your child promptly**. SCHOOL FORMS

SCHOOL SUPPLIES

As a service to families of students in elementary school, the Richmond School District has purchased school supplies at significantly reduced prices. Students are charged \$30 for school supplies which include items such as glue sticks, pencils, pens, notebooks, duotangs, crayons, pencil crayons, felts, rules, etc. The supplies purchased should last the year, but families might be asked to purchase extra glue sticks or felts later in the year. In addition, some divisions will be asked to purchase a school agenda. The cost of the agenda is \$5 and it is specially designed for student use. Some classes may not be purchasing an agenda if the teacher is not going to use one. Your teacher will let you know if this is a required item.

Recently, the provincial government announced a new, one time <u>Student and Family Affordability</u> <u>Fund</u>. This fund is designed to assist families who require financial assistance with school-related costs such as school and course fees, workbooks, specialty supplies, field trips and other schoolrelated charges and costs. The additional funding will also be used to support school meal programs and other nutritional supports for students.

At this time, we are requesting that families reach out to Mrs. Loat if you are in need of assistance with school supplies, fees or other school-related costs. As always, all requests will be treated with dignity and your privacy will be respected. We want to work with our families to ensure that our students, your children, have everything they need to be successful at school. Please do not hesitate to reach out if we can help.

Please note that staff may temporarily confiscate these devices should they find them disruptive to learning and/or if used without permission.



Also, we remind parents and students that sadly, the theft of cell phones and personal music devices sometimes happens. The school is not responsible for the theft or breakage of cell phones and personal music devices. We advise students and parents that these devices should be either left at home or in students' backpacks at all times, but <u>off</u> during the school day. School phones are available for all students to contact home should the need arise.
