Indigenous Veterans Day, observed on November 8 in Canada, honors the contributions of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit veterans. Established in 1994, it acknowledges the bravery and sacrifices of Indigenous soldiers in various conflicts, celebrating their service and raising awareness of their important role in Canadian military history.



National Inuit Day, celebrated annually on November 7, honors Inuit culture, heritage, and the significant contributions of Inuit communities across Canada and the circumpolar world. Established in 2006 by Inuit Tapiriit Kanatami (ITK), an organization representing Inuit interests in Canada, this day recognizes the importance of Inuit traditions, language, and the challenges faced by Inuit communities. It is a time to raise awareness about Inuit rights, promote the protection of Arctic environments, and advocate for social, economic, and cultural initiatives that support Inuit well-being. National Inuit Day serves as a reminder of the rich and resilient Inuit culture and the ongoing efforts to preserve it for future generations.

This video presentation will be followed by a facilitated discussion by the Family Peer Support Workers in Richmond.


