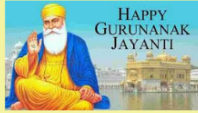

Indigenous Veterans Day: Nov. 8



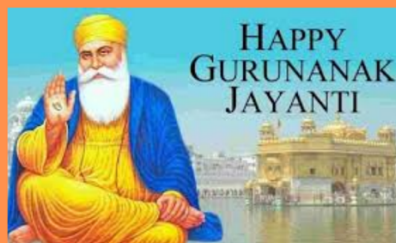
International Inuit Day, sometimes referred to as National Inuit Day, is observed annually on November 7. It is a day to celebrate and amplify the unique cultures, languages, history, and contributions of Inuit across the circumpolar region, including Canada, Alaska, Greenland, and Russia.



Indigenous Veterans Day is held every year on November 8 in Canada to honor the significant contributions and sacrifices of First Nations, Inuit, and Métis people in military service.

Thousands of Indigenous people volunteered and served with distinction in Canada's military conflicts, including the First World War, Second World War, and the Korean War. However, upon their return, many faced systemic discrimination, including being denied the same benefits and support as non-Indigenous veterans.

Indigenous Veterans Day was first observed in Winnipeg in 1994, initiated by the National Aboriginal Veterans Association. The date was chosen specifically to ensure that Indigenous veterans could have their own ceremonies to honor their specific history and sacrifices.



The birthday of Guru Nanak Dev Sahib is celebrated as Gurburab to commemorate the birth of the first Sikh guru and founder of Sikhism. This festival honors his life and teachings, which emphasized equality, selfless service, honest work, and devotion to God. Celebrations involve various religious activities and community gatherings, such as prayers, communal meals, and processions, to celebrate the principles he laid out.

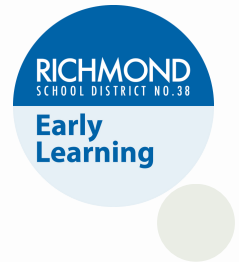
