Significant Dates in our Community



Halloween: Oct. 31 Musqueam Day: Nov. 1





- The celebration is linked to the ancient Celtic festival of Samhain, which marked the end of summer and the harvest and the beginning of the cold, dark winter. Celts believed the boundary between the living and the dead blurred on this night.
- The name "Halloween" is derived from "All Hallows' Eve," the evening before <u>All Saints' Day</u> (November 1st).
- The holiday combines these pagan traditions with Christian observances, which include <u>Allhallowtide</u>, a three-day period dedicated to remembering the dead that starts on Halloween.



Musqueam Day is an annual holiday celebrated on November 1 by the Musqueam First Nations to commemorate the 1984 Supreme Court of Canada <u>Guerin decision</u>. This landmark ruling established the Crown's fiduciary duty to Indigenous Peoples and affirmed the government's obligation to act in their best interests. The day is a celebration of the ancestors' fight for justice and the protection of their inherent rights.

Halloween

Halloween should and needs to be fun; however, we need to be aware that celebrating Halloween needs to be fun for all. Halloween offers an opportunity to have meaningful conversations about costume choices with colleagues and students and requires consideration. It is important to keep in mind that we need to be sensitive to groups that have been marginalized through mimicry and cultural appropriation during Halloween and other 'dress up' events. A few things to keep in mind:

It's good to keep in mind that the following are NOT costumes:

- RACE (black face/brown face)
- CULTURE (Indigenous regalia/dreadlocks)
- RELIGIOUS FAITH (religious figures/gods/saints/gurus/hijab)
- GENDER (gender switching for humour or to mock)
- TRAUMA (hangman's noose/weapons)


